The Bateman Vineyard has continued to perform exceptionally well for us. The 2009 was a big hit and the 2010 follows up quite nicely. The style of the wine has been set, providing a perfumed nose highlighted with notes of lilac and fresh cut flowers but evolves into a deep and serious fruit profile with elements of black cherry, fresh berry jam, and cola. The silky elegant yet weighty entry and mouthfeel of this wine is what sets this wine apart. This wine is delicious from the beginning, but will age nicely for years to come.

*The 2010 Pinot Noir Bateman Vineyard comes across as a bit bombastic in this vintage. Black cherries, hard candy, flowers and sweet spices seem to burst from the glass. The exuberance and power of the Dijon clones come through loud and clear. There is plenty of depth in the glass, but a little less in the way of finesse. Anticipated maturity: 2013-2018. - 88 pts..*
