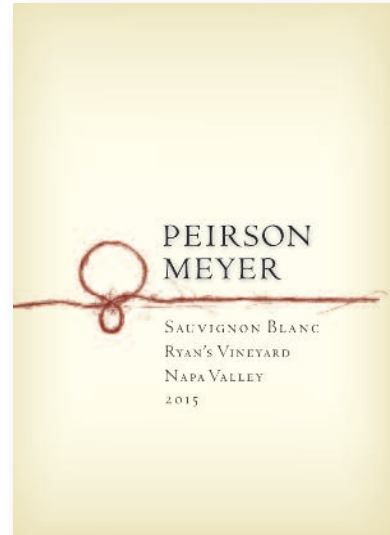

Located on the Oak Knoll District in the heart of Napa Valley, Ryan's Vineyard named after owner James Verhey's son is the source for our much loved Sauvignon Blanc. This vineyard with its alluvial soils produces consistent wonderful fruit from 18 year old vines.

The 2015 Sauvignon Blanc Ryan's Vineyard was fermented with indigenous yeasts in neutral French oak and barrel aged eight months in the same neutral oak. Loads of honeysuckle, melons, creamy citrus and grapefruit are all present in this terrific, zesty, medium-bodied and nicely textured Sauvignon Blanc from the Oak Knoll sector of Napa Valley. | 91 points |
