We are pleased to present our third offering of Cabernet Sauvignon. The aromas show intense classic Napa Valley character with ripe blackberry, currant and anise complemented with rich components of vanilla and chocolate; highlighted by unique floral and perfumed elements of lilac and rose petal. These characteristics give the wine nuanced complexity and interest. This wine has a wonderful silky, elegant entry that gives way to a fully structured, weighty midpalate revealing it's Pritchard Hill origin. A luscious finish completes this wine that is great in its youth, but promises much for the future.

The 2007 Peirson Meyer Cabernet Sauvignon comes from a vineyard on Pritchard Hill that was acquired by Tim Mondavi (it's the backbone for his brilliant Continuum offerings). A deep ruby/purple color is followed by notes of blueberries, blackberries, licorice, vanilla and spring flowers. The wine possesses a gorgeous texture, admirable opulence and a layered, full-bodied mouthfeel. This sensational, seductive Cabernet Sauvignon is already delicious and should evolve for 15 or more years. -94 pts.
