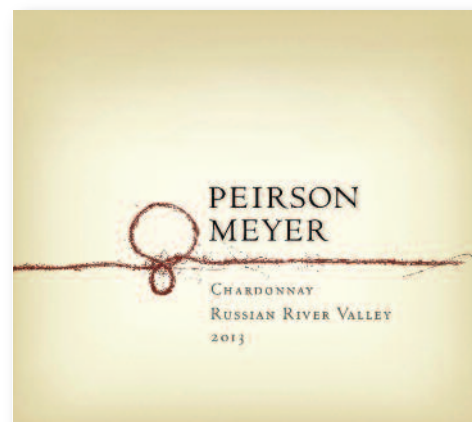

The 2013 Chardonnay from the Russian River Valley is a real winner, and at \$38.00 a bottle, it's a heck of a value as well. Aged 14 months on its lees in about 40% new French oak, the wine shows loads of white peach, honey-suckle, brioche and a touch of mango in a classic, full-bodied, Russian River style. The wine is nice and spicy, pure, and best drunk over the next 3-4 years.
