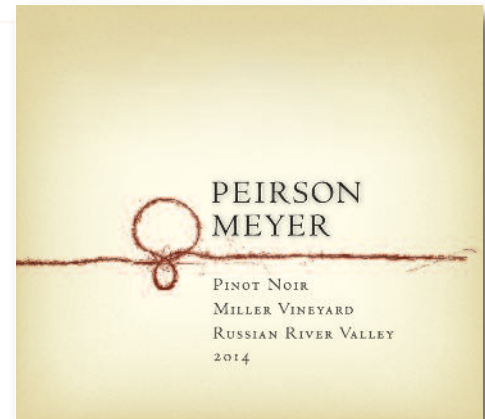

Offering fruit and floral nuances of ripe cherries, wild strawberry, rose petals and jasmine, this seductive wine continues to evolve both in the glass and in the bottle revealing its more subtle notes of vanilla spice and stoney minerality. The palate is incredibly seductive with its smooth soft structure and silky finish.

Miller Vineyard

Just an acre located on the southern edge of Graton, this north facing vineyard lies on a gentle slope that protects the fruit from the hot afternoon sun. Planted in 1998 in Goldridge soils the vines are trained on a vertical trellis.

The 2014 Pinot Noir Miller Vineyard was treated similarly as the Bateman, but is a much lighter color as it is from 100% Dijon clone 828. This has the forest floor, rose petals, sweet strawberry and cherry notes, but the killer aromatics is what gives this wine sensational appeal. It is medium-bodied, fleshy and should be drunk over the next 5 to 6 years to take advantage of the exceptional fragrance it offers. | 94 points |
