

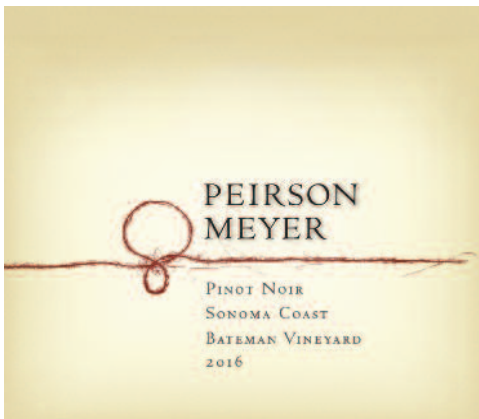

The 2016 Pinot Noir Bateman Vineyard is bold and punchy in the glass, with terrific fruit intensity and plenty of volume. It is also the most overt of the three Pinots in the range. Red cherry, berry, cola and wild flowers are nicely layered throughout. - 92 pts.

Bateman Vineyard

The Bateman Vineyard lies at 700 feet above sea level, north of Sebastopol on Mill Station Road. Planted in Goldridge soils the Pinot Noir vines are trained on a vertical trellis system (VSP) on north eastern facing slopes that offer protection from the hot summer afternoon sun.
